He arrived in Singapore at the age of 17, without a cent to his name. Yet, when he died, Tan Kah Kee had (1) <u>achieved</u> more in his lifetime than most people could ever hope to. (2) <u>Frequently</u> referred to as one of Singapore's pioneers, he made a great impact on education (17) in Singapore.

Tan Kah Kee worked initially as an apprentice for his rice merchant father when he arrived in Singapore in 1890. He later went on to start his own business and (3) made a fortune selling rubber and making rubber products, which earned him the nickname "the Rubber King". At the age of 45, he was one of the richest men in Singapore but Tan Kah Kee was not satisfied with merely enjoying the trappings of his wealth. Instead, he made it his (4) commitment and duty to see that thousands of young people would benefit from the education he would help to provide.

Today, the legacy of Tan Kah Kee (5) <u>lives on</u> in many educational institutions he helped to establish here. This is quite an achievement for a man who had only eight years of formal education as a child.
