



Years passed and we commuted everywhere by bus, train and taxi. We could not believe our luck when the government built a train station just a stone's throw away from our house. We were thrilled beyond description with the convenience of the station almost at our doorstep. Furthermore, we could go to any place we wanted as the train travelled all around Johor from there. It felt like we owned our very own Toyota. Although train travel got easier, the bus remained our favourite option. We enjoyed bantering with one another, feeling the wind caress our faces and watching pedestrians, shopping malls and houses rush past in a blur.

Every Christmas, we visited our grandparents in Selangor. It was a long and arduous journey. We took three different buses to get to the old rubber estate where our grandparents lived. Unperturbed by the journey, we looked forward to the familiar scent of the rubber plantations that assailed our senses. We could hardly contain our excitement knowing that our destination was around the corner. Despite our parents' constant reminders to be careful when we stuck our heads out, we eagerly looked out for our cousins who also waited in anticipation for us at the old bus stop. A joyous time of merriment awaited us as we looked forward to the many games we planned on playing

with them. Though we did not have many luxuries, I had a happy childhood filled with wonderful memories.

The prospect of a two-hour plane ride all alone had my stomach in knots. After settling down in my new apartment, I called Mother to talk to her. Before we ended the call, she uttered, "Your sister is planning to get a car," she said. "A Toyota." I smiled as I recalled my childhood desire. Suddenly, a realisation dawned on me - owning that elusive car did not seem to matter anymore.
