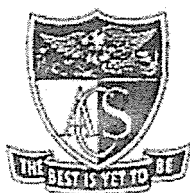

**How does your book series help spread awareness of the need for good eye care?**

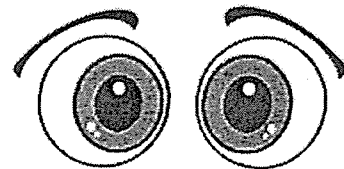
