The answer was a goldfish!

I bought Tina a bowl, a little plastic house for the fish to swim through, some coloured gravel and a small light that kept the little aquarium illuminated. Tina kept the bowl on the nightstand next to her bed. That way, she had enough light to make her feel safe and a "friend" to murmur to quietly before she fell asleep. The light from the fishbowl was dim so that did not bother Kelly. Both of them liked having a pet.

Tina fed that fish like clockwork. One day, I caught her staggering with the fishbowl and told her that Mother and I would take charge of changing the water instead. Ever since then, she would remind us to clean the bowl more often than we would have liked. She was always careful about adding the anti-chlorine drops to the fresh water, lest her fish die a toxic death. She also named her fish creatively. Some days, it would be "Jaws", other days it would be "Swirmmy". The gender of the rish also varied according to Tina's whim.

Since goldfish do not live for very long, my mother and I became co-conspirators in the game, making sure that Tina always had a live goldfish in that bowl. 
