If you practise with salt in your shoes every day, you'll be taller before you know it!" she replied. 11

"Salt in my shoes?" Michael said quietly to himself, scrunching his eyebrows. At the same time, he noticed the rose bushes outside in Mama's garden. They had grown high along the fence, and roses of all colours were blooming on the vines. Michael's face lit up. If Mama knew how to make those rose bushes grow tall, then maybe she was right. Mama came home that Saturday and found Michael looking gloomy. "What's wrong, son? Are you okay?" 25

He said, "It didn't work. I can't be a great player if I do not grow taller."

"But you are a great player, son. You already have everything it takes to be a winner, right in here," Mama tapped Michael on his chest. "Being taller may help you play better, but not as much as practice, determination, and doing one's best. Those are what make you a real winner."
