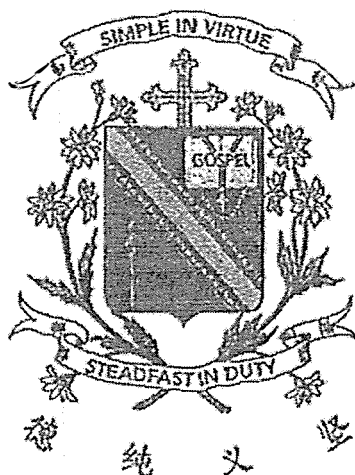

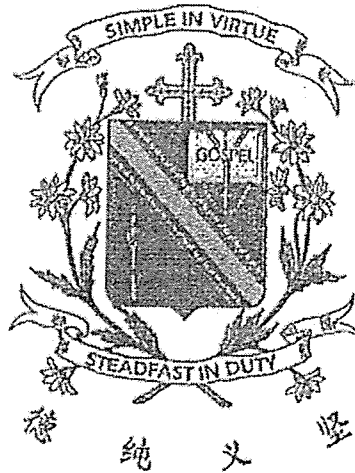

The birth of giant panda cub *Le Le* in August 2021 brought much cheer and joy to all Singaporeans. It was the result of years of hard work and dedication from the animal care teams of the Singapore Zoo. It was also a significant breakthrough of Mandai Wildlife Reserve's breeding programme.

Altogether, births at the zoo were spread across 160 species. 44 of them are listed as threatened by animal conservation authorities. The giant panda is presently classified as vulnerable. They are notoriously difficult to breed in captivity. Thus, the breeding of the giant panda outside of China is quite rare.

Under an arrangement made between the Singapore and China governments, the baby panda will return to China when it turns two. Meanwhile, *Le Le* charms its curious visitors with its unbearable cuteness.

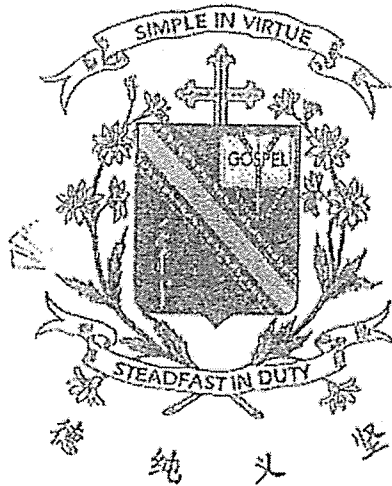
