

After I graduated from university, I pursued my dream rolentlessly and managed to set up my own dance company despite numerous setbacks along the 35 way.

Being the most inquisitive child in our family, I used to ask my mother all sorts of questions that I had and she was ever so patient to answer me. Before she passed away four years ago, I asked her why she was always willing to answer my questions no matter how silly they were. She merely smiled and said, "That's one of my ways to show my love for you. I am sure you will do the same for your children in future."


